Lessons in Week 5-8 will focus on covering the remaining syllabus dot points for the topics of Religion and Non-Religion and Religion and Peace, as well as revision focused on these topics through past HSC exams. This revision will focus on timed responses in exams as well as developing essay plans and thesis statements under timed conditions.

Week 8-10 will focus on revising all topics ahead of the final HSC exam. Students may tailor their revision to suit their own needs in these sessions, as well as participate in class revision activities.

Week 1 of Term 4 will consist of revision through games. This week will also allow students to seek face-to-face help on any specific aspect of their revision.
