Changes to provision of DER Laptops

Part of the Digital Education Revolution (DER) was a commitment by the government to ensure each student from year 9 upwards had a laptop to assist them with their learning. This roll out has happened over the last 4 years. However the program is ending due to funding cuts. This also will see the end of the Technical Support Officer in schools after next year.

We will be receiving one last bundle of DER laptops for 2013. These will not be distributed to students in year 9, but rather will be available as additional banks of laptops in the school for all students in years 7 to 9 to access in the classroom. Fortunately most of our families from PHS have computer access at home, and for those that don't the local library have computers with internet access available. Nevertheless this is a challenge for us all, in how to expand and grow as a technology rich school at a time of such cuts. This term we are completing a technology audit with a view for careful but bold planning for the future.

I was greatly entertained and amazingly impressed by a variety of performances from classical piano music to lively rock; from light show to dramatic monologues; from glorious vocals to energised dancing. MONA VALE - WILMETTE SISTER CITIES

PITTWATER - NEW TRIER HIGH SCHOOLS

The association between Pittwater High School and New Trier High School began at the end of 1988 when the then Principal of Pittwater High School, Mr Irwin announced to staff that Sister Cities International was seeking a Pittwater teacher to send to the United States on a teacher exchange. At that time a dialogue existed between the libraries and the Baha'i communities in both townships and Mona Vale and Wilmette had formed a Sister Cities relationship. Several community leaders had visited Wilmette and several Wilmette people had also toured the northern beaches of Sydney.

The teacher exchange was a concept developed by the US Information Agency as a gift to Australia in our bicentenary year. They asked the Sister Cities International organisation to identify ten sister city communities that would exchange teachers so that teachers from both countries would go into classrooms, while on exchange, and share with students a little of their culture. Ten Australian teachers were identified and after a short orientation program flew to the US in December 1988. Mr Mitchell was the Pittwater High School teacher selected to travel to Wilmette and teach at New Trier High School. This teacher was hosted by a Social Sciences teacher at New Trier by the name of Mr Stewart, who in mid 1989 flew to Australia to complete the second half of the exchange program.

The two teachers during the exchange had such a positive and rewarding time that they conceived a plan to organise a yearly exchange of students between the two schools. During 1989 year 10 students were invited to apply to go to the US and attend New Trier High for three months starting in October of that year. The first successful student was Tracy Mills who was hosted by an American student who had been selected by the Sister Cities group in Wilmette. The Pittwater selection committee was composed of Principal, teachers and community representatives with the addition of parent representatives in subsequent years. The first Wilmette student was Sally Rosenthal who arrived in Sydney in June 1990 and attended Pittwater for approximately two months.

During the next selection cycle two Pittwater students were selected for the exchange program and the following year the growth continued with three students being selected to attend school in the US. It was during 1992 that the second Pittwater teacher, Mrs Perdriau, was sent to New Trier High to continue to forge new bonds between the schools. Again, a deep and lasting friendship was built between the teachers so that the program continued to develop and four students were sent to the US during 1993.

Mr Shead, along with three students, was the third Pittwater teacher to be selected on the exchange program for 1994 and two New Trier teachers came to Pittwater during that exchange cycle. At this point in time, four year 10 students are awaiting their turn and they will be flying out to the US in January 2013.

As a result of the ever closer ties between the two schools, the Pittwater High School Band toured to the US and was hosted by the music department at New Trier High School. Sixty students, four teachers and five parents made up the touring party and they all had a extremely valuable learning experience both culturally and musically.

To help overcome the financial burden such a student exchange may cause prospective exchangees, the Pittwater Student Exchange Committee organises fund raising activities such as school dances, curbside house numbering, cake stalls, sausage sizzles and telephone book distribution. This committee donates \$1000 to each exchange family to help offset the costs of exchange.

The level of community involvement in this program continues to increase with such activities as Pittwater Council Civic Receptions, barbeques at the Baha'i Temple and the Pittwater Sister Cities Committee activities which has teacher and parent representatives.

Since the beginning of this program, approximately 100 year 10 students have participated in the exchange. There has been four band tours and seven Pittwater High teachers have stayed at New Trier High.

Each year we now send four Pittwater students to Chicago to stay with the families of students attending New Trier High School. Those US students then attend Pittwater High School the following year.

This is a wonderful program that continues to foster international understanding and goodwill.

Pittwater High School are once again collecting Christmas food and presents for Anglicare.




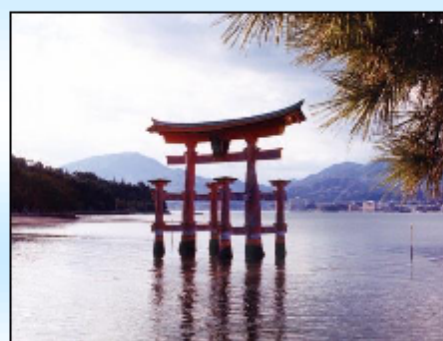
