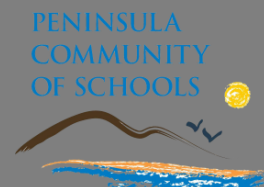

Presentation Night Address



For those families not at Presentation Night, I thought I would share with you my address:

It is with great pleasure that I stand here tonight at the end of my first semester at this remarkable school – Pittwater High. When I first arrived I was immediately impressed and have continued to be by the positive atmosphere in the school where students are confident and friendly, while staff are clearly hard working and caring, always with the students' best interest in focus. I have also been greatly impressed by the school's emphasis on quality teaching and learning where students are supported and encouraged to aspire in achieving their personal best as responsible learners—and as a school we are blessed with such a wonderful location and spacious grounds for all to enjoy.

So what is it that makes this school so remarkable and special? Ultimately it is that sense of community where all parts are working together so that the school continues to grow from strength to strength.

The first remarkable part of this school community is the students themselves. As is evident tonight, there are many young men and women who have excelled and shown commitment in their learning, sporting endeavours and school service. They are to be congratulated on their individual performance. As I walk around the school and drop in on classes, students in the main are focussed, engaged in their work and cooperative in the classroom. Many are achieving academic excellence. In the creative and performing arts, the students are nothing short of brilliant as evident in the various concerts and displays I have had the pleasure of attending. Our student leaders are fantastic, being positive role models in the school and always displaying respect, integrity, a sense of social justice and empathy for others. It is certainly a highlight of my job, when I sit down with the senior leaders each fortnight.

Quality teaching and learning do not just happen. Excursions, camps, student interviews, special programs, concerts, reports, timetables, formals, presentation evenings, extra curricular activities - do not just happen. Indeed the second remarkable part of this school community is the staff – without a doubt they are incredibly committed to their students and work very hard. To all staff I say a very special thank you. Since I have been here, the staff have shown a willingness to take on board new ideas and make a positive input into the direction and vision of this school. Staff constantly go out of their way to support students in their learning as was particularly evident in the lead up to the HSC exams. This term we have been introducing a new software program called Sentral which will more effectively link together timetable, reports, attendance, and student welfare thus allowing us to effectively monitor student progress – despite a few glitches those involved have worked tirelessly in this period of transition. Staff are eager to further embrace technology as an effective teaching and learning tool, and with your support we will be significantly expanding technology hardware next year.

While I am mentioning dedicated staff, it would be remiss of me not to mention two very special staff that are leaving the school. Although this is not my normal practice on an evening that focuses on student achievement, I must acknowledge the years of service, starting at Pittwater in 1979, of a very passionate and dedicated history teacher and an amazing advocate for public education. Margaret Vos - we thank you so much and wish you all the best in your retirement. Also as you know Tania Turik is to be congratulated on her promotion to Principal at Terrigal High School. Tania has made a significant contribution in leading this school over the last nine years. Thank you for your contribution and all the best at your new school.

Partnership with parents is the third crucial part of any school community, and I acknowledge the input of mums, dads, caregivers and grandparents in supporting our students in their education. When you communicate to your child high expectations about school work, attendance and uniform, you are working in partnership with us in providing quality education. When you commit to paying your school contributions, even when for some it is a financial struggle, you enable us to put in yet more resources to enhance the quality of education. And when you attend our different information evenings, parent teacher interviews, P&C meetings, concerts, Visual Art displays and Presentation Evening to celebrate your child's achievements – you are not only better informed but communicate to our students that you value their public education. It is one of our targets to continue to build our partnerships with parents and the broader community, especially as we celebrate our 50th anniversary next year.

The future holds many challenges for us all in public education. With state government cuts of \$1.7 billion, at the very time the Gonski Review clearly demonstrated that there needs to be an increased investment in education, should be of concern to us all. It has just become a lot harder to deliver quality education to our children. However as a glass half full person, I am determined that despite these cuts we will continue to grow as a school. Building on strong foundations and with a strong vision, Pittwater High School will become an even more remarkable school – one that is recognised for being progressive and a leader in education. I am greatly looking forward to the challenges as we move forward in raising the bar for 2013 and beyond.

I will conclude by saying I have felt very honoured and privileged to have been appointed as Principal at Pittwater High School. I thank everyone, parents, students and staff, for being so welcoming and supportive in my first semester. I look forward to working with you all for many years to come.

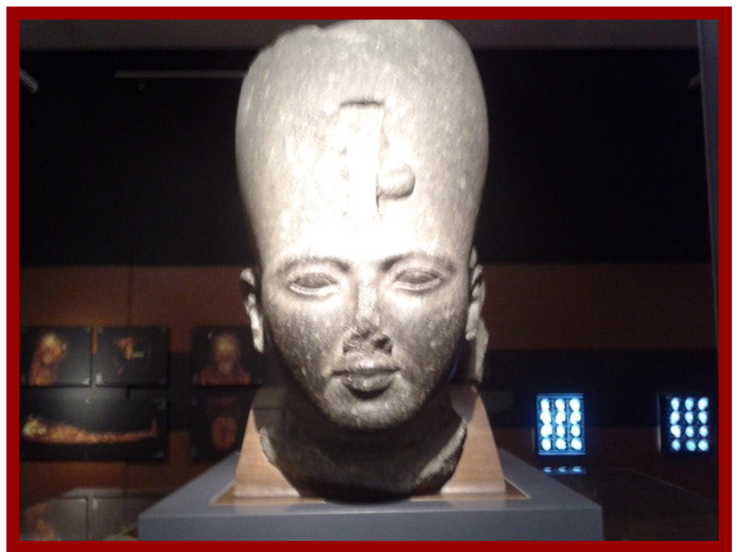

Risk Notice

Civil Liability Act 2002

Sailing is a sport that involves interacting with the uncontrollable and difficult to predict elements of nature, and therefore involves a degree of risk. Many of the risks inherent in the sport are intuitive. Without seeking to list all possibilities the following are brought to your attention:

- There is a significant risk of bruises, cuts, scratches and other injuries resulting from contact with the boat or collision with other boats. Flapping sails, or unanticipated changes in wind direction or in the direction of the boat can cause a spar to bump the head or other part of the body or cause a rope flick injury. These injuries can occur both afloat or while near a boat on land.
- When launching or coming ashore, hard surfaces below the high tide line can become slippery, resulting in slip and fall injuries. Oysters and other sharp marine creatures can also grow on these surfaces. Stinging jelly fish or other marine stingers may be present in the water. Sharp objects can be hidden in sand or weed below the water which can cut or pierce feet or other parts of the body. Proximity to the elements makes it more likely for nails or splinters to be raised in wooden decks and floors and these can also cause foot injuries and trip hazards. The wet feet of sailors can make surfaces slippery.
- Because of reflected glare, sunburn will occur more rapidly than normal on unprotected skin. Dehydration or hypothermia can occur in those who do not heed and prepare for the conditions.
- Most injuries are relatively minor. However on occasions the injury can be more significant.
- When sailing dinghies on inshore waters, really serious injuries of the type that can cause permanent disablement or even death are statistically very rare but can and do occur. As with any water sport, the possibility of drowning is also present. While for many sailing activities a patrol boat might be present, the boat cannot be everywhere at once, can not observe every incident that occurs and may not always recognise an observed incident as being a serious one requiring immediate response. First aid or medical assistance is not available.

I have read and understood the above risk warning and I agree that I participate in the sport of sailing at my own risk and I acknowledge that neither The Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club ("Club") nor any official, volunteer or member shall be under any liability whatsoever for the death or bodily injury, loss or damage which may be suffered or incurred by me or the minors for whom I am responsible. I also acknowledge that neither The Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club nor any official volunteer or member shall be under any liability for any loss or damage to personal property which may be suffered or incurred by me or the minors for whom I am responsible.

I understand that I or the minor for whom I am responsible may be photographed while participating in activities conducted by the Club and I hereby give permission for the use of my name or the name of the minor for whom I am responsible to be used in all forms of media for the promotion of the Club.

- Always examine launching ramps before using them to see how slippery they are;
- Always check the weather forecast before going sailing. Always follow the directions of your Instructors.
- Do not run or skylark when around the Club, especially on the car park, marinas and on launching ramps;
- Beware of flapping sails;
- The Club is not responsible for supervising minors while ashore. This is the responsibility of their parents or delegated adult.
