Prohibited employment declaration

Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998



The *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998* makes it an offence for a prohibited person (a person convicted of a serious sex offence, the murder of a child or a child-related personal violence offence, as well as a Registrable person under the *Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000*) to apply for or otherwise attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in, child-related employment. It does not apply if an order from the Industrial Relations Commission, Administrative Decisions Tribunal or Commission for Children and Young People, declares that the Act does not apply to a person in respect of a specific offence.

For further information on what is child-related employment see the *Working With Children Employer Guidelines*.

Section 33B of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998* defines a serious sex offence as:

- An offence, involving sexual activity or acts of indecency, committed in New South Wales and that was punishable by penal servitude or imprisonment for 12 months or more; or
- An offence, involving sexual activity or acts of indecency, committed elsewhere and that would have been an offence punishable by penal servitude or imprisonment for 12 months or more, if it had been committed in New South Wales; or
- An offence under section 80D or 80E (sexual servitude) of the *Crimes Act 1900*, committed against a child; or
- An offence under Sections 91D-91G (child prostitution, other than if committed by a child prostitute) of the *Crimes Act 1900* or a similar offence under a law other than a law of New South Wales; or
- An offence under Section 91H, 578B or 578C (2A) (child pornography) of the *Crimes Act 1900* or a similar offence under a law other than a law of New South Wales; or
- An offence of attempting, or of conspiracy or incitement, to commit an offence referred to in the preceding paragraphs; or
- Any other offence, whether under the law of New South Wales or elsewhere, prescribed by the regulations.

NOTE: A conviction for carnal knowledge is classified as a serious sex offence under this legislation.

Section 33B of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998* defines a child-related personal violence offence as an offence committed by an adult:

- Involving intentionally wounding and causing grievous bodily harm to a child; or
- Of attempting, or of conspiracy or incitement, to commit such an offence

Under Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998:

- It is an offence for a prohibited person to apply for or otherwise attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in child-related employment;
- Employers must ask existing employees, both paid and unpaid, and preferred applicants for child-related employment to declare if they are prohibited person or not;
- All people in child-related employment must inform their employers if they are a prohibited person or remove themselves from child-related employment; and
- Penalties are imposed for non compliance

I am aware that I am ineligible to apply for or otherwise attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in, child-related employment if I have been convicted of a serious sex offence or child-related personal violence offence as defined in the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*, or if I am a Registrable Person under the *Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000*.

I have read and understood the above information in relation to the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*. I am aware that it is an offence to make a false statement on this form.

I consent to a check of my relevant criminal records, to verify the statements I have made here, being undertaken by the NSW Commission for Children and Young People for monitoring and auditing purposes in accordance with Section 36 (1)(f) of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

I declare that I am not a person prohibited by the Act from seeking, obtaining, undertaking or remaining in child-related employment.

I understand that this information may be referred to the Commission for Children and Young People and/or to NSW Police for law enforcement purposes and for monitoring and auditing compliance with the procedures and standards for the Working With Children Check in accordance with Section 36 (1)(f) of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

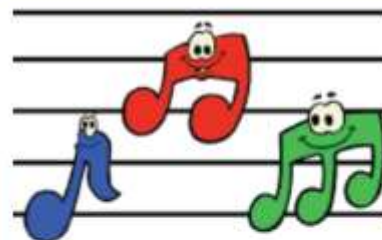

Disability Provisions for the School Certificate tests and Higher School Certificate examinations

INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

The Disability Provisions Program (previously special examination provisions) has been enhanced for the 2011 Higher School Certificate examinations and School Certificate tests.

The program has been renamed to better reflect its purpose: providing access to external examinations for students with a permanent or temporary disability. The Disability Discrimination Act and the Disability Standards for Education require the Board of Studies to ensure that students with a disability are able to access and respond to an examination.

This leaflet is designed to inform students who have a disability and their parents of the possibilities available to assist them during the Board of Studies' examinations.

If you have a disability, whether it is related to a physical condition, visual impairment, hearing loss or a learning difficulty, you should read this leaflet and discuss it with your parents, Year Adviser, teacher or School Counsellor.

What are Disability Provisions?

The Office of the Board of Studies has developed the Disability Provisions Program to assist you in completing the School Certificate tests and Higher School Certificate examinations.

The program offers practical support to students by granting justified provisions such as coloured examination papers, extra time to rest, writers or readers.

Applying for Disability Provisions

From 2011, all applications for disability provisions must be submitted and processed electronically by the students' school/college for students who intend to sit for the School Certificate tests or Higher School Certificate examinations. Applications are lodged and decisions are reported through Schools Online.

If you wish to apply for disability provisions you should see your Year Adviser or School Counsellor. In applying for provisions the following steps should be taken:

1. You should advise the school of the provisions for which you are applying.
2. The relevant school/college staff will need to indicate on your application how your disability affects your work in the classroom and in an examination situation.
3. Evidence of your disability must be included (for example, medical evidence, timed essay samples or reading test results).

If all the necessary information is not provided, the application will be declined.

When a decision has been made, the Office of the Board of Studies will provide the school with decision letters electronically through Schools Online. The school will be able to provide the student with their copy of the letter.

Applications close at the end of Term 1, although disability provisions for emergencies (for example, a broken arm) are accepted until the time of the examinations.

Appeal procedures

An appeal against the Office's decision to decline a provision must be submitted electronically by your school within 14 days of receiving your decision letter. The appeal must state the reason why the Office's decision is unsuitable and make reference to the evidence supplied in the original application.

The appeal must include new supportive evidence such as further medical reports, which clearly state why the provision is needed, or additional reading, writing or spelling test results.

The Office will conduct an independent review and a decision will be made within 21 days. The decision will be reported to the school through Schools Online. The school will be able to provide the student with their copy of the letter.

A note to Higher School Certificate students

If you were granted the use of disability provisions for your School Certificate tests, this does not automatically deem that you will be eligible for the same provisions for the Higher School Certificate examinations. Any application for disability provisions for the Higher School Certificate must be accompanied by current, detailed evidence of your examination difficulties.

A note to parents

If you are concerned about whether disability provisions apply for your child, you should contact the Year Adviser or School Counsellor at your child's school.

The application must be submitted by your child's school as it requires specific information regarding the difficulties your child may experience in a classroom or examination situation. This does not mean, however, that you should not be involved in the application process.

Roads around all schools in the Pittwater area operate at peak capacity during the morning drop off and afternoon pick up periods. This flyer will provide you with some suggestions on where you can drop off and collect your children around Pittwater High School as well as information on parking restrictions and penalties that apply in school zones.

We recommend that you plan your journey around the school and use a drop off and pick up point that enables you to leave the area quickly without creating further congestion on the roads around Pittwater High School.

Suggested drop off and pick up areas

Pittwater Road

You can park on Pittwater Road to drop off or collect your child. Please ensure that your child uses the pedestrian crossing if you are using the side of the road opposite the school. Be aware of areas that restrict parking, such as bus zones and pedestrian crossings.

Winnereremy Bay car park

You can use this car park to drop off or collect your child. Students can enter or exit the school by using the gate which joins the car park. Parking fees apply to vehicles not displaying a valid Pittwater parking permit.

Mona Street

Parking is available on Mona Street close to the reserve and is only a short walk away from the school. Please ensure that you park legally by not parking across driveways or double parking.

Nallion Street

You can drop off and collect your child on Nallion Street in the no parking areas. No parking applies to some areas of Nallion Street between 8.30am - 4pm on school days and to other areas at all times. You can park here for no more than 2 minutes and must not move more than 3 metres from your vehicle.

No stopping - \$258 and two demerit points

Areas marked **no stopping** are where you are not permitted to stop or park your vehicle at any time. Dropping off or picking up passengers is not permitted under any circumstances.

No parking - \$147 and two demerit points

Areas marked **no parking** are where you are not permitted to park your vehicle longer than 2 minutes and move more than 3 metres away from your vehicle.

Double parking - \$258 and two demerit points

Double parking blocks line of vision, obstructs traffic flow and can force passing vehicles onto the wrong side of the road.

U-turns - \$258 and three demerit points

U-turns confuse other drivers and pedestrians and are a common cause of traffic congestion.

Bus zones - \$258 and two demerit points

You are not permitted to stop your vehicle to drop off or collect your child in the bus zones on Mona Street or Pittwater Road. Bus zones are in operation on Mona Street between 8am - 9am and 2.45pm - 3.45pm on school days and at all times on Pittwater Road.
