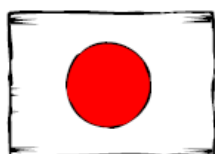

EXCURSION TO THE TIMBER AND WORKING WITH WOOD SHOW

On Friday 27 July an amalgamation of Industrial Technology and Construction students visited the Sydney Timber and Working with Wood Show at Homebush.

This is an annual event which showcases the latest and innovative tools, equipment, timber projects, educational resources and interactive displays. The students had the opportunity to watch professional demonstrations by exhibitors, including lathe turning, timber cutting, vacuum forming, shaping and 3D routing.

The highlight of the show was the InTech exhibition of outstanding 2011 Practical Major Design Projects for Industrial Technology. Past HSC candidates were available to discuss their project and the folio expectations. It was noted that these successful students had been thorough in their preparation and started the construction of their work early in Term 4 of Year 11 in order to achieve their potential. The projects included a range of timber furniture including a detailed trinket box with drawers, coffee table with turned legs, display cabinet and side table. The students were both inspired and appreciative of the time and effort that goes into producing such fine work.

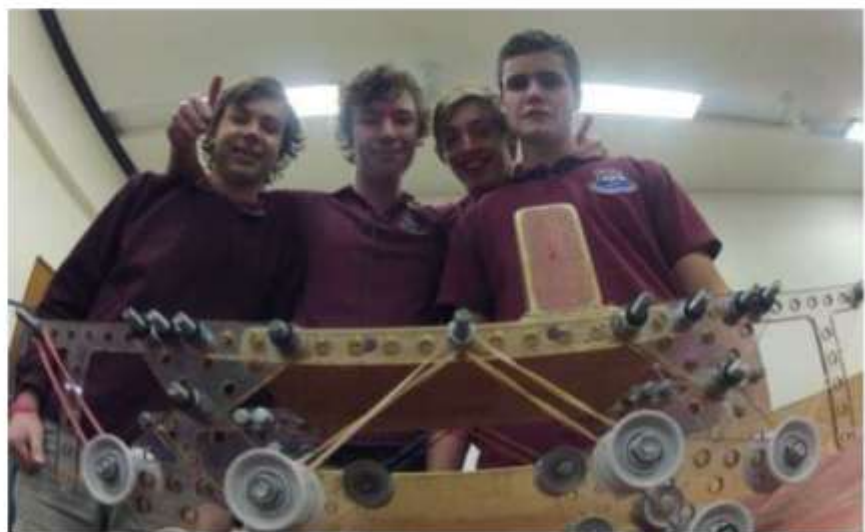
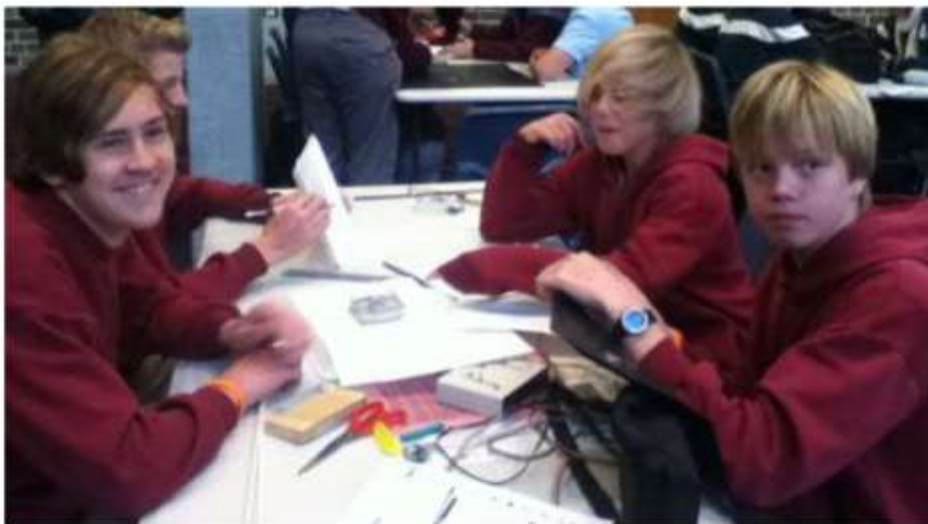

Our students performed extremely well and came second to Sydney Boys Technology High, which is a selective high school. In fact The PCS students were leading the competition going into the last event. One

highlight was the four Pittwater boys who designed a vehicle to transport a load across an uneven surface. They set a new Australian record for speed in this event. Well done to all the team.

NSW All Schools Rugby League Finals

After winning the Manly/ North Sydney All Schools Under 15 carnival PHS qualified for the State finals along with eleven other district winners from all over NSW.

The finals were staged at Werrington near Penrith and it was a cold, early start to playing footy, with our first game against the Western Suburbs winners, St Pauls, Greystanes. During a tight first half our Captain and five-eighth Daniel E scored our maiden try for the competition with a smart effort close to the line and converting it to give us a halftime lead 6-0. Early in the second half we dodged a bullet with Sam G making a diving, try-saving tackle across the line, dislodging the ball. Not long after Daniel showed advanced skills and maturity beyond his years in kicking a 40-20, putting us on the attack. From the ensuing scrum he then was instrumental in a superb move that found fullback Connor B in a huge gap and he finished beautifully to score next to the posts. Daniel converted to give us the final score of 12-0 and a great start to the tournament.

Our next opponent was Kogarah HS representing the St. George district. On the back of two barnstorming runs from fourteen year old second rower Lachie R, Luke M muscled his way over early in the game. Unfortunately we then lost concentration, letting in two soft tries in our worst period of the day. We had a number of golden opportunities to level the score and go on to win the game but self-destructed on each occasion, losing 10-4.

We therefore had to defeat the Penrith area champions, Erskine Park HS to stay alive in the competition. In this game we really clicked winning 20-0 in a brilliant attacking display and resolute defence. Sam scored a majestic try off a Daniel chip kick, taking the ball at full speed in the air while the effervescent centre Clint M scored a stunning 70 metre individual try, shrugging off a number of defenders and beating the cover with great speed. Josh W then scored out wide from a sensational long ball off Daniel before Tyler S completed the domination. Daniel kicked two conversions in this comprehensive victory that catapulted us to the top of our pool and into the semi-finals.

There we played the Western Suburbs winners, Sarah Redfern HS in what was an outstanding game of schoolboy rugby league. In an incredibly high standard match, PHS really put the very talented opposition under pressure. We went so close to scoring on three occasions with both wingers being tackled into touch off sweeping backline moves and halfback Scotty E losing the ball over the line. Halftime was 0-0 in a riveting first stanza. Sarah Redfern were first to score in the second half before PHS threw everything at them. Clint M look destined to score off an audacious, but spectacular midfield kick by Daniel from a scrum win. If the ball had bounced straight or to the left he would have regathered. Unfortunately it bounced to the right, into the opposing fullbacks hands as they raced for the ball. We then received a penalty deep into opposition territory and were on a roll when a freakish ball strip on the first tackle saw us lose the initiative and eventually led to another try to Sarah Redfern, giving them a final 10-0 edge. It was truly a great game of footy with absolutely nothing in it. Pittwater should be very proud of competing so well against the best in the State, particularly as Sarah Redfern only lost the final 14-12 to Holy Cross College, Ryde.

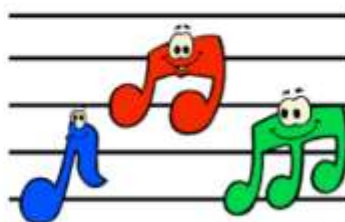
