The recent cold snaps have brought out the usual incorrect jumpers from some students. I would also encourage parents to check regarding the wearing of leather shoes. This is a Work Health and Safety issue in many classes. Students are being excluded from some classes because it is unsafe for them to participate in scheduled activities. From 2014 the school will not be accepting suede shoes as a part of the school uniform.

I invited her to stand outside the school as our students left to get on the buses to check on uniform compliance. We will be very pleased when we get to 100%.

I congratulate them for their hard work and wish them the best for their performances in the HSC. I have also seen a video produced by a year 7 student for music that made me smile and taught me about film, music and composition. I was fascinated by the demonstration of year nine technology students' work in creating machines that could move soft drink cans using hydraulics, levers and wooden off cuts. Apparently the students are going to make mouse trap cars and have already asked the teacher to make the task "harder" or is that "harder fun"!

I am often asked by parents about how to talk to teenagers? I have seen many thousands of young people and certainly wouldn't call myself an expert but I have learned that if you want to communicate you need to set up a situation where you are not "in their face". The car is the perfect place to talk, leaning against a rail or a wall. At the dinner table, the family dinner is the best place and a ritual worth developing. As I often call students to my office and have to talk with them I know that "come in and sit down I need to speak with you" doesn't always work, particularly if there is an important issue to be discussed. 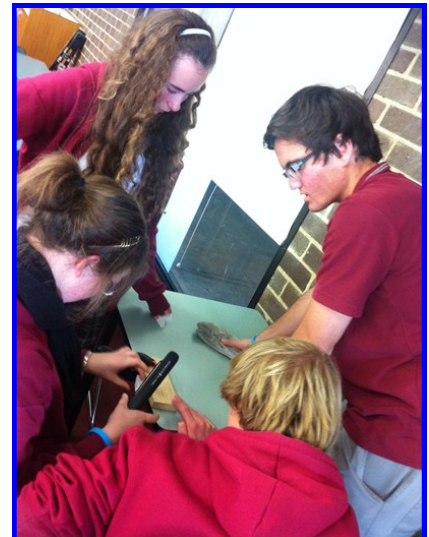
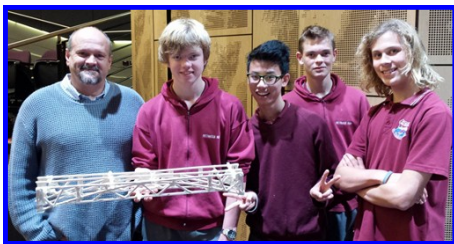

After the lunch break, we went back to the auditorium to discover that there was a team of academics from the university also building a bridge. SCIENCE ENGINEERING CHALLENGE by Rick Mitchell—Head Teacher Science

The Science Engineering challenge is an annual competition run by Newcastle University. There were eight schools at Macquarie University on the day we competed. The competition consists of each school forming eight teams of four to five team members. Each team is required to design and manufacture various models. The tasks are varied with some teams asked to design propellers, Mars buggies, Eco houses, Towers to withstand earthquakes, Electricity grid systems or air cannons.

Macquarie University hosts three days of competition as do other Universities right across Australia. Pittwater High has been involved in the competition since 2007. In 2008 the Pittwater students combined with Barrenjoey HS and Narrabeen HS to win the Sydney competition. This team then won the Newcastle competition as well and so went to the national competition on the Gold coast where we came fourth in Australia.

This year's team worked incredibly well and are a credit to the school. They participated extremely well within their teams and several groups won their challenge.

I was proud to be associated with this group of young men and women.

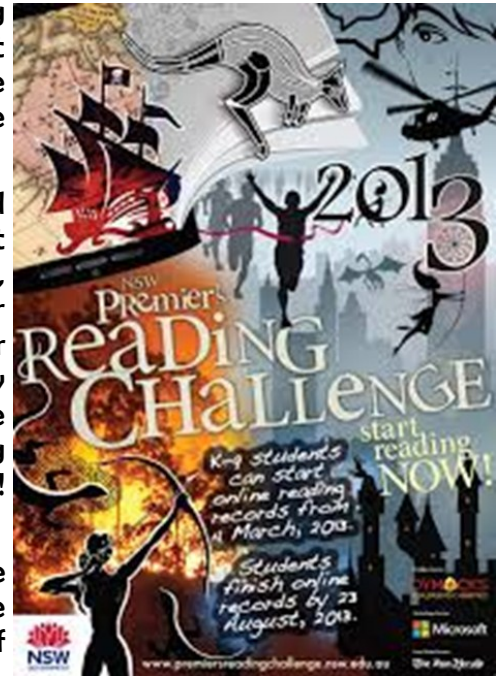
THE 2013 PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE FINISHES ON 1ST SEPTEMBER

YEAR 7 GRAPHICS

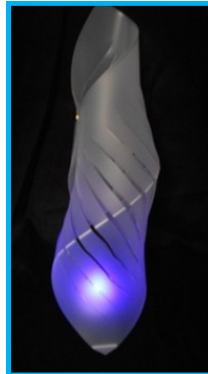

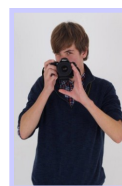
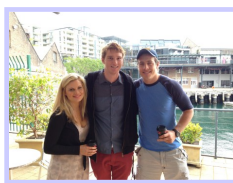
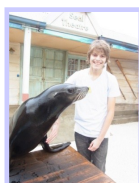
YEAR 11:
