



Vocational Education and Training at Pittwater High

Principal's Report—Jane Ferris

At Pittwater High School we are very proud of the diverse range of subjects we offer that cater for the different interests of students. An important component of this choice is the vocational education and training (VET) industry framework courses we teach in Hospitality and Construction.

The Trade Training Centre enables Hospitality students to prepare food to industry standard. It is fully fitted out with commercial equipment, including a combination oven and commercial stoves, mixers, bain marie coffee machine, preparation room, fridges and freezers, scullery (washing up room) with commercial dishwasher and storage and all the equipment for students to use. I was delighted today when two Year 10 students in the accelerated Hospitality class visited me to show and share their amazing hazelnut meringue gateaux – and yes, it tasted as great as it looked!



Construction students also complete practical and theoretical components of the course, along with 70 hours of work placement at local building companies. The students' practical work has enhanced the school with projects such as creating concrete slabs for agriculture, tiling and outside picnic tables.

Part of offering VET in schools is to comply with stringent standards of the Australian Skills Quality Authority. Last week our school participated in an all day audit where programs were viewed, resources and work samples assessed, and students and staff interviewed. Overall our school demonstrated an excellent platform of delivery and we were praised on having best practice for delivery of these courses in the region. **Congratulations to all the VET teachers and students.**

Community Forum on 'Raising Resilience in Teenagers'

The community forum last week was excellent with the outstanding keynote speaker, psychologist Phil Nunn. Parents and staff in attendance found him so insightful that many have requested that Phil returns next year to speak again. A huge thanks to Acting Deputy Principal Rachel Fleming for organising this event.

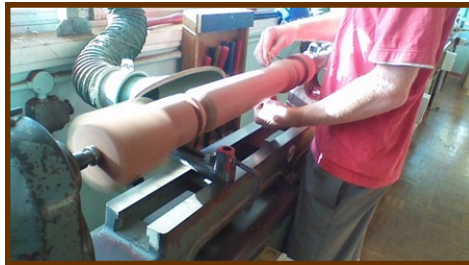

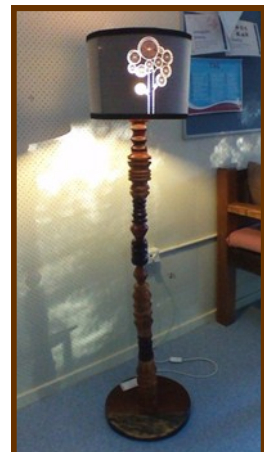
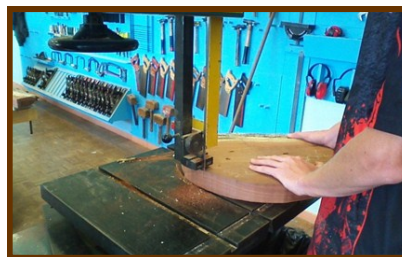

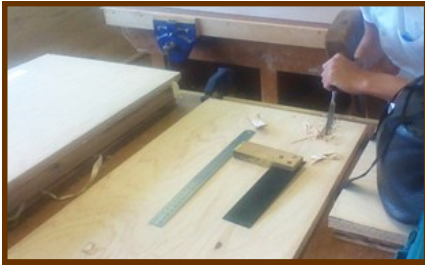

YEAR 10 ENGINEERING

Alternative Energies and Built Environments

During term 1 and 2 engineering students studied alternative energies and the importance of sustainable design. The class developed a variety of skills including Architectural design and drafting, Computer Aided Design and scale model making. Students were asked to redesign their current houses or design a new house on their existing block of land with their new knowledge and no budget. Considerations included positioning of the windows, walls and entire house, floor plan based on direction and sun exposure, use of sustainable materials, passive design and alternative energy and water systems. Students also compared their current household water and power usage and evaluated the savings of a more sustainable system if implemented.

YEAR 12 TEXTILES AND DESIGN

As part of their Higher School Certificate the Year 12 Textiles and Design class complete a Major Project which is made up of a practical article and a portfolio. These combine to be worth 50% of the students' HSC mark. These projects were due last week, and have now been packed up and posted off to the Board of Studies for marking.

The class have achieved excellent results using a variety of techniques such as free hand machine embroidery, applique, laser-cut designs, stamping, shisha embroidery, beading, and many other creative and innovative decorative methods. The garments are also all sewn to a superb standard. Each student completed a project from one of the following focus areas: Textile Art, Furnishing, Apparel, Costume, Non-Apparel.

The projects will be returned in November and the school will have a display of these wonderful works.

The photos do not do justice to the detail and hard work that is evident in all of the projects. I congratulate the class on their dedication and look forward to their results.

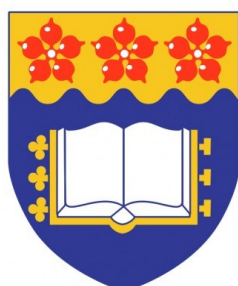

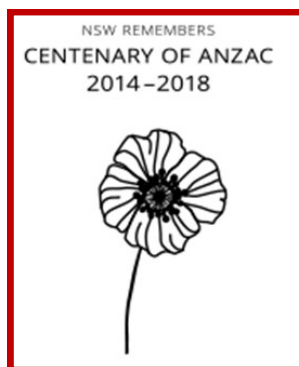

GALLIPOLI SCHOOL TOUR



Pittwater High's Application for the 2015 Gallipoli School Tour has been submitted!

Our school has submitted an application for the **Gallipoli 2015 School Tour** ballot. The NSW Government will invest up to \$1million to enable 100 students and up to 28 supervising teachers the opportunity to attend the official Anzac Day Centenary Commemorative Services at Gallipoli in 2015. The NSW Government will fund the cost of students' and supervising teachers' travel, accommodation, meals, visas, full entrance fees, travel insurance and all transfers (including travel to and from Sydney).

25 successful schools will be drawn in the ballot to be held on Monday 1 September 2014 and the schools will be officially notified in writing by Friday 5 September 2014. The schools or school groups drawn in the ballot will be required to conduct a local selection process to nominate four students and one supervising teacher to attend the Gallipoli 2015 School Tour.

We have gathered the names of many interested students, including a relative of an officer who was killed during his service in Gallipoli, as well as the great-grandson of former NSW Governor and Victoria Cross recipient Sir Roden Cutler.

So it's fingers crossed for Pittwater High as we await the outcome of the ballot to see if four of our wonderful students will have the opportunity to attend this once in a lifetime commemorative event!

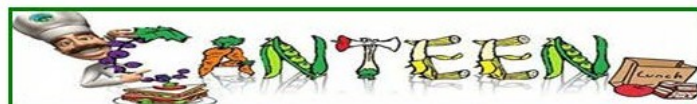
