

IN SEARCH OF ROBERT FROST



The under 16's were very competitive in reaching the semi-finals but the unavailability of a few key players hindered our chances of winning and qualifying for the state finals, a feat not beyond this team. PHS however, added to our reputation as a rugby league school this season with four out of our five gala day teams making the semi-finals in their respective age groups from 13 years to open age. Our under 15 team coached by Mr Trout were also finalists in a competition that invites both private and state schools from all over the northern part of Sydney.

The 16's started well with an 8-nil win over the always strong Cromer High through a kick regather try by Harry Binding and a great team try by Ek Lambert-Leplastrier.

We then easily accounted for Narrabeen Sports 12-nil which could have been a much bigger win except a couple of balls were dropped over the try line. Luke Trbojevic, who was a handful for defences all day, scored one try while Daniel Chun finished off a 50m break down the left edge from Toby Jones to cross out wide. Adam French converted both tries.

Fatigue started to have an effect as three reserves are not enough in a round robin structure. The boys scored first against the formidable Balgowlah Boys, with Luke finding the line and Adam converting. We then lost concentration and allowed Balgowlah to get back into the game. We never regained our momentum and went on to lose a game we were capable of winning, 14-6.

Regardless of that loss, we placed second in our pool and qualified for a semi-final against Asquith Boys. Being understrength took its toll and Asquith overran us 20-4 with Luke keeping the score respectable, scoring a well-deserved try. Lock forward Luke and five-eighth Harry along with halfback Pat Gililand led the team well and were outstanding in attack and defence all day. Hooker Adam and fellow forwards Dylan Ferguson and Zac Dinter impressed as did youngsters Toby Jones and Callum Bowden, playing up an age group.

Year 9 is currently in the process of creating their own cooking show (in French) for an assignment.



The Year 10 Japanese class has been focusing on learning advanced grammar skills and improving their ability to write Japanese texts.
