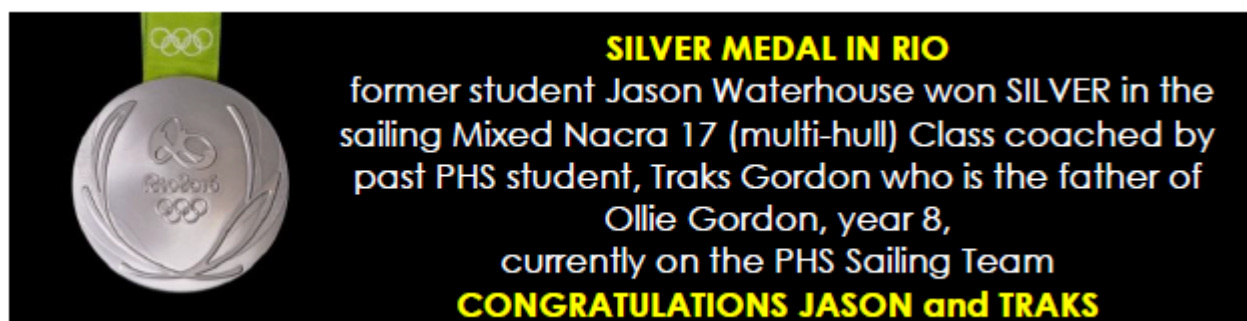
DEPUTY PRINCIPALS' REPORT - Rachel Fleming and Martin Hardy (Relieving)

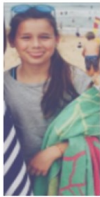

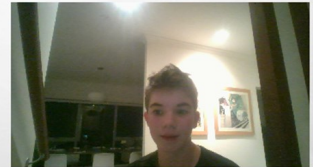

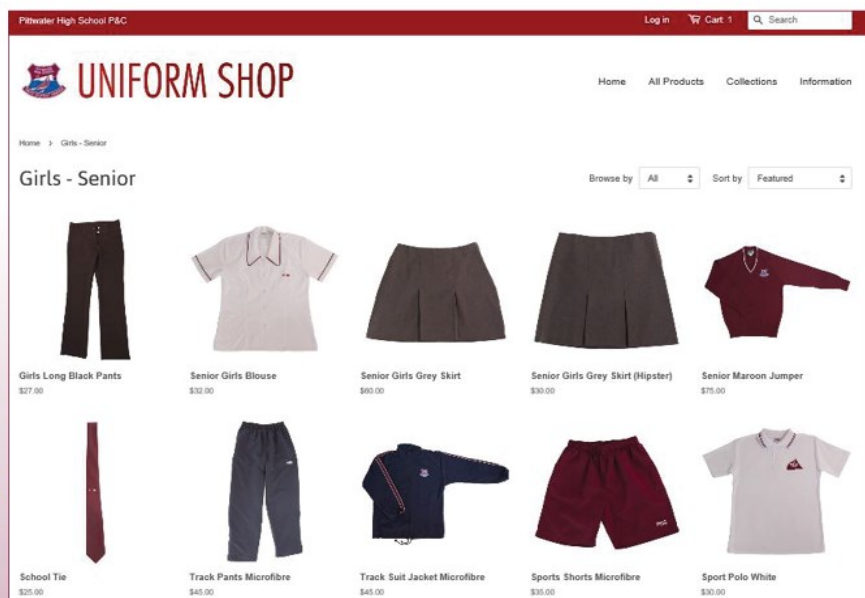
