STOP PRESS: OUTSTANDING HSC RESULTS 2018

Jane Ferris: Principal's Report

The Class of 2018, with 112 students sitting HSC exams, achieved amazing results. Of 37 courses studied, 65% were well above the state average. For example, accelerated **Aboriginal Studies** was 18% above the state average with 94% students achieving a Band 5 or 6 compared to 23% in the state. **French Beginners** were 13% above the state average with 71% gaining a Band 6 compared to 22% in the state. **Industrial Technology** was 9% above state average with 22% gaining Band 6 (state 6%) and one student's major work selected for the **Shape Exhibition at the Power House Museum. Agriculture** was 9% above the state average with 29% gaining a Band 6 compared to 7% in the state. Indeed PHS was ranked 7th in the state with only selective schools, agriculture high schools and private schools ahead of us. Other exceptional results were in Visual Arts, Society and Culture, Ancient History, Modern History, Textiles and Design, Accelerated Hospitality, General Mathematics, Music and extension courses in English, Maths and History. These fantastic results have led to us being placed 155th overall of all schools in the state, a rank above many neighbouring private schools. Comparing like for like, full comprehensive coeducational public schools only, Pittwater High is 13th in the state.

We are also very proud of the incredible achievements of Jaz Cremin who topped the state in General Mathematics with 100% in her HSC – a course with over 30,000 students. In addition, Jas came 8th in the state in Earth and Environmental Science. She also is the recipient of the Premier's All Rounder Award with Band 6s in all her courses, and received an ATAR of 98.75. Jas hopes to study Science/Law at either University of Sydney or Macquarie University, the latter having just offered her a scholarship.

One thing the data available to the public does not show, is the amazing growth this cohort has demonstrated over the years. As a group, they really settled into their studies in the senior years, showing a real connection to each other and the school. Teachers are to be thanked for going beyond their duty in giving immeasurable support to students, whether in reading drafts, supporting through meltdowns or ensuring quality lessons. Some students faced difficult circumstances this year while others did not have a natural aptitude for study. But the clear personal best for these students with sound marks in the 70s and/or 80s is truly a great accomplishment.



We look forward to seeing as many of these students as possible at our HSC Morning Tea this Wednesday at 11.00am. Also 50 students have qualified and been invited to our High Achievers Recognition Assembly on 11 February 2019.
