

### NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In **Term 3**, the following clinics will be running:

#### **Important Information for Year 10 Parents**

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be distributed to Year 10 students in Week 1 next term.

These forms should be returned to the **Student Services Office**.

On the clinic days, students should ensure they eat breakfast, and if possible, wear a short-sleeved shirt, to allow the nurses to easily administer the vaccine.

Parent Information Kits including an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of your child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- Read all the information provided
- Complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- Return the completed consent form to your child's school
- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note that if a student is absent from a clinic they will be offered any missed doses at subsequent clinics during Year 7 or 8 (for HPV and dTpa vaccination) and during Year 10 (for Meningococcal ACWY vaccination). They do not need to go to their GP for these vaccines because they are absent from a school clinic.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at <a href="https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/">www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/</a> withdraw consent.aspx.

A Record of Vaccination card will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. Details about vaccinations given at school will also be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to support complete vaccination histories.


