#### **Principal's Report**

Term 3 is flying by with subject selection evenings, NAIDOC Assembly, prefect and captain elections, completion of major works, the Taito City Study Tour, Resilience in Our Teens (RIOT) implementation, wellbeing workshops, Year 11 camp and Book Week celebrations, just a sample of the many initiatives that take place to support and enrich learning for students. I would like to acknowledge how fortunate we are to have an amazing team of teaching and non-teaching staff who all work above and beyond to make this happen.

#### **Commendation Assemblies 2024**

Students, teachers, parents and carers celebrated learning on Monday 19 August with Commendation Assemblies for Years 7-9 and 10-12. Students who received an award did so because they had shown a commitment to learning and demonstrated learning dispositions. All teachers have been working with an academic partner to embed learning dispositions into teaching and learning programs. Each Key Learning Area has chosen three to focus on and these were listed on the student's award. Learning dispositions are designed to support students to learn throughout school and set them up for learning and life beyond school. The list includes, but is not limited to; persistence, grit, resilience, self-regulation, curiosity, collaboration, creativity, initiative and systematic problem solving.

#### Resilience in Our Teens (RIOT)

All staff at Pittwater High School engaged in Resilience in Our Teens (RIOT) professional learning on School Development Day and all students in Year 7 have now completed a series of seven lessons. Approximately 40 parents are engaged in the online parent workshops. RIOT is a whole school approach to managing anxiety by taking practical steps to build 'resilience thinking' in teenagers. Students learn to recognise cognitive distortions and learn strategies for self-acceptance and acceptance of others. Year 8 will commence their program of lessons in Week 6 Term 4. ## RESILIENCE IN OUR TEENS RIOT



This year our school is undertaking a project to address student anxiety called the Resilience in our Teens (RIOT) project. A central element of RIOT is for the students to be brave and to 'have a go' – not to avoid difficult tasks or situations that are within their ability.

A central element of the RIOT project is for students to develop the knowledge and understanding of how their brain works, how to identify anxious feelings, and how to develop the skills to regulate their emotions.

In the sessions so far, students have learned about the following:






